We have made changes to the manuscript in light of all of the reviewer's comments on the paper that were sent in a supplementary PDF to the main review. The tracked changes document shows these in detail. The main elements are summarised below:

- Change in title removing reference to equality diversity and inclusion to: A role for Virtual Outcrop Models in Blended Learning: improved 3D thinking and positive perceptions of learning
- Rephrasing of BAME acronym to remove confusion around this term internationally.
- Use the phrases like 'little tested' rather than 'has not been rested' to avoid misrepresentation if we have missed examples in our literature search.
- Included references to support drinking culture statement (Rose, 1993; Miller, 2018; Guertin, 2019).
